Summer Camp Traffic plan

McMaster's summer camp programs for local children begin Monday June 29, 2009. Each year several thousand area children are able to enjoy the McMaster campus and engage in some summer fun and educational development.

Last year, neighbours' feedback on the revised camp traffic management plan was overwhelmingly positive. This year, we're repeating the same plan. A police officer will be stationed at the intersection of Mayfair Crescent and Forsyth North, and an increased number of campus traffic marshals will guide parents and vehicles through campus. Directions and campus maps were issued to parents as they prepare to drop off and pick up their children. These directions included reminders to enter campus via Sterling Street and not to park or stop on Mayfair or Forsyth. School buses will drop off/pick up and park on campus.

Summer camps operate in two-week cycles. Experience has shown that it may take a few days at the beginning of each cycle for parents to familiarize themselves with the parking and traffic routing. This is also the first camp year for McMaster's automated gate system, so parents may require additional time to acquaint themselves with procedures at the start of each camp cycle.

As always, your patience is greatly appreciated as we work to ensure a successful and safe camp season for all stakeholders. To ensure that local residents have a clear idea of McMaster's camp parking procedures, we have attached a camp-specific map for parking throughout program cycles. This map was distributed to all parents of campers.
