**LRT Open House**

Hamilton's rapid transit team will hold a campus open house and public information session in the Donaldson Family Marketplace in MUSC from 11:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. on Jan. 28. The community is invited to attend.

The City will provide preliminary design and route proposals, share information about the economic impacts of LRT and will display a video simulation of the proposed B line route that would run from Eastgate Square to McMaster.

The University supports the LRT project and is working with the City to determine the most appropriate campus location for an LRT stop.
